FESTIVAL DAY BEGINS

Up with the lark are the festival committee and their helpers to set up Pilton Street, Rotary Garden and the Stages. Bins to put out, marquees to erect, participants to be directed to their positions for the day. Bacon butties and a mug of tea wouldn't go a miss!

THE PROCESSION

The Procession starts from Barnstaple Square at 10.45am and makes its way along the High Street, then Pilton Causeway and processes up Pilton Street, turning right into Pilton House Grounds. Look for the large Red and Green Masks leading the way!

THE PAGEANT

(Pilton House Grounds 12 noon and 3pm)

The Green Man is an ancient Pagan symbol of nature and fertility frequently depicted in carvings in old churches as a face sprouting foliage. A splendid green man carving can be seen in St Mary the Virgin Church in Pilton.

The Prior of the Benedictine Priory of Pilton lived at The Bull House below the Church until the reformation. The ritual enacted at Pilton Festival is believed to represent the initial antagonism of two characters, Prior and Green Man, represented by Red and Green Masks and the subsequent inclusion of the pagan figure within the church. Under the direction of Hamish Patrick, it takes place on the lawn in front of Pilton House at 12 noon and again at 3pm.

Pilton Street &

Central to Green Man Day is Pilton Street, with the hustle and bustle amongst the stalls, the arrival of the procession and a day of music from the three stages.

In recent years, festivities have expanded in to the



comfort of Rotary Gardens, a splendid setting for family based activities with children's soft play and free play areas and a handcranked Victorian merry- go- round.

Dotted amongst the trees, arts and craftsmen will demonstrate their skills and local interest groups and charities will 'set out their stalls'. The enchanting interactive story-tellers Entertainingly Different will be performing, or you might chance upon a choir singing beneath a tree, a performance by a local school drama group, or be accosted by the charming knee-high puppets of Tinderbox.

We are pleased to be marshalling the Festival Procession and attending with our gig boat "Lady Freda" on Festival Day to promote the club and generate interest in the sport of gig rowing. We recently attended the World Championships on The Isles of Scilly and climbed the rankings from last year. Out of a record 129 male crews our Mens A crew came 43rd & Mens B - 120th. 123 female crews competed, our Ladies A crew came 86th & Ladies B - 117th. The men's Supervets also put on a very impressive performance and finished just outside of the top 10 in their category.

In August 2012 we founded the Barnstaple Pilot Gig Club Junior Section, who are now known as the "Barum Blades". We currently have a very keen group of youngsters who train together at least once a week - tides and times willing. They will no doubt be competing at the World Championships in years to come.
